**AN ACT TO AMEND THE PUBLIC HOLIDAYS PROCLAMATION (CHAPTER 44)  
BY REDEFINING THE DATE ON WHICH PRESIDENT'S DAY IS TO BE OBSERVED.**

Date of Assent: 30.12.68.

Date of Commencement: 31.12.68.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

**Short Title**

1. This Act may be cited as the Public Holidays (Amendment) Act, 1968.

**Amendment of Section 2 of the Public Holidays Proclamation (Chapter 44)**

2. Section 2 of the Public Holidays Proclamation (hereinafter referred to as the principal law) is amended by the addition of the following further proviso:

“(c) When the last Monday in May is Whit Monday, the following Tuesday shall be observed as President's Day”.

**Amendment of the Schedule to the Public Holidays Proclamation (Chapter 44)**

3. The Schedule to the principal law, is amended by the deletion of “President's Day (24th May)” and the substitution of “President's Day (last Monday in May)”.

Passed by the National Assembly this day, the 12th December, 1968.
