

THE POLICE CANTEENS ACT, 1969

AN ACT TO PROVIDE FOR THE SALE WITHOUT LICENCE OF GOODS AT POLICE CANTEENS AND TO ENABLE THE ESTABLISHMENT OF ADDITIONAL CANTEENS TO BE AUTHORISED.

ENACTED by the Parliament of Botswana.

Short Title

1. This Act may be cited as the Police Canteens Act, 1969.

Interpretation

2. In this Act —

“authorised persons” means serving members of the Botswana Police, special constables appointed under the law relating to the Botswana Police, and officers of the Prison Service.

Sale of Goods without Licence at Police Canteens

3. Notwithstanding anything in any other law, it shall be lawful for any person engaged in operating a canteen under the control of the Commissioner of Police which is named in the First Schedule, or any other canteen which may be established under the provisions of section 4, to sell without any licence at such canteen to authorised persons goods of any of the categories set forth in the Second Schedule.

Power to Authorise Establishment of Police Canteens

4. It shall be lawful for the President by order published in the *Gazette* to authorise the establishment under the control of the Commissioner of Police of canteens at any place within Botswana for the sale to authorised persons of goods of the categories set out in the Second Schedule.

Repeal of Chapter 110

5. The Canteen Licences Trading Proclamation is repealed.

Amendment of Section 3 of Proclamation No. 69 of 1960

6. Section 3 of the Liquor Proclamation, 1960, is amended in subsection (2) by the deletion in paragraph (d) of the words following "Canteen" and the substitution therefor of —

"named in, or established under the provisions of, the Police Canteens Act, 1969, to authorised persons referred to therein."
