GEMSBOK NATIONAL PARK ORDER, 1971

(Published on the 23rd July, 1971)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 3 of the National Parks Act, 1967 His Excellency the President has made the following order —

1. This order may be cited as the Gemsbok National Park Order, 1971. Citation
2. The area of State land described in the Schedule hereto is constituted a national park and is named Gemsbok National Park. Constitution

SCHEDULE

Commencing at a point 10 miles due west of the middle of Mabuaschube Pan the boundary runs due south for a distance of 27 miles; thence south-westwards to the summit of Flyskop; thence south-westwards to a point 10 miles due east of the middle of the gate of the South African Kalahari Gemsbok National Park Headquarters at Twee Rivieren; thence due west to a point on the international boundary between Botswana and South Africa opposite the middle of the gate at the South African Kalahari Gemsbok National Park Headquarters at Twee Rivieren; thence generally north-eastwards and north-westwards following the international boundary between Botswana and South Africa to the intersection of this boundary with the international boundary between Botswana and South West Africa at Unions End; thence northwards following the international boundary between Botswana and South West Africa for a distance of 45 miles; thence south-eastwards to a point 8 miles due north of the point of commencement; thence due south to the point of commencement.
