ARRANGEMENT OF BYE-LAWS

BYE-LAW

1. Citation
2. Interpretation
3. Licensing of bicycles and tricycles
4. Offence and penalty

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by regulation 16 of the Selebi-Pikwe Township Regulations, 1970, the Township Authority, with the approval of the Minister for Local Government and Lands, hereby makes the following Bye-laws —

1. These Bye-laws may be cited as the Selebi-Pikwe (Cycle Licensing) Citation
Bye-laws, 1973.

2. In these Bye-laws, unless the context otherwise requires — Interpretation

“bicycle” includes child’s bicycle;

“child’s tricycle” means a tricycle of a size ordinarily used by children under the age of twelve years;

“child’s bicycle” means a bicycle of a size ordinarily used by children under the age of twelve years;

“current licence disc” means a licence disc valid for the current year;

“licensing officer” means a revenue officer of the Township Authority;

“tricycle” means a three-wheeled vehicle propelled by means of pedals, whether or not designed or adapted for the carriage of goods, but does not include a child’s tricycle.

3. (1) No person shall own, keep or use a bicycle or tricycle within the Township unless it is licensed in terms of these Bye-laws and has affixed to it a current licence disc. Licensing of bicycles and tricycles

(2) A licence under these Bye-laws shall be issued on behalf of the Township by a licensing officer on payment of the fee hereinafter prescribed.

(3) When issuing a licence under these Bye-laws the licensing officer shall record the name and address of the person to whom it is issued, the date of issue, identifying particulars of the bicycle or tricycle in respect of which it is issued, the identifying number of the licence disc and the fee paid.

(4) Such licence shall be issued in respect of a twelve month period commencing on the 1st January in any year terminating on the 31st December of the same year on payment of a fee of 50 cents in respect of a bicycle or tricycle other than a child’s bicycle or tricycle, and of 25 cents in respect of a child’s bicycle.

(5) Notwithstanding the provisions of paragraph (4) a licence issued under these Bye-laws shall authorize the keeping of the bicycle to which the licence relates up till 31st January of the next succeeding year.

(6) A licence issued under these Bye-laws shall be in the form of a metal disc impressed with the year for which it is issued and an identifying number.

(7) Such disc shall be affixed to the bicycle or tricycle in respect of which it is issued and shall be kept affixed to the bicycle or tricycle at all times by the person having the bicycle or tricycle in his possession.

(8) A licensing officer on being satisfied that a current licence disc issued on behalf of the Township Authority has been lost, damaged or destroyed shall issue a replacement disc on payment of a fee of 15 cents.

(9) A replacement disc shall be a metal disc impressed with the year for which it is issued and an identifying number, and paragraph (3) shall apply to the issue of a replacement.

Offence and
penalty

4. Any person who contravenes any of the provisions of these Bye-laws shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine of R10 or, in default of payment, to imprisonment for one month.
