**REGULATION OF WAGES (HOTEL, CATERING AND ENTERTAINMENT
TRADES WAGES COUNCIL) (ESTABLISHMENT) ORDER, 1976**

(Published on 31st December, 1976)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred by section 4 of the Regulation of Wages and Conditions of Employment Act, the Minister of Home Affairs hereby makes the following Order ---

1. This Order may be cited as the Regulation of Wages (Hotel, Catering and Entertainment Trades Wages Council) (Establishment) Order, 1976. Citation

2. There is hereby established a Wages Council (to be known and hereinafter referred to as the "Hotel Catering and Entertainment Trades Wages Council") to perform, in relation to the employees specified in the Schedule, the powers and functions specified in that behalf in the Act. Establishment
of Wages
Council

3. The Hotel, Catering and Entertainment Trades Wages Council shall consist, as to independent members, of a Chairman, a Deputy Chairman and one other, and, as to representative members, of not more than two persons to represent employers, and not more than two persons to represent employees.

SCHEDULE

All persons employed in any undertaking or part of an undertaking which consists of the carrying on (whether for profit or not) of one or other of the following activities, that is to say, the supply of food or drink for premises licensed under the Liquor Act, or the provision of living accommodation for guests or lodgers or the provision of entertainment: Cap. 45:01

Provided that persons employed in an undertaking or part of an undertaking --

(i) in any trade affected by a Wages Council Order made under the Act; or

(ii) which is operated by the Government,
shall be excluded.

In this Schedule, "undertaking" includes any person, firm, business, company or club, and the activities of any body whether corporate or incorporate, whether carried on by way of trade or not.
