ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

REGULATION

1. Citation
2. Insertion of new Regulation 18B in Cap. 69:03 (Sub. Leg.)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Works and Communications by section 28 of the Road Transport (Permits) Act, the following Regulations are hereby made —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Road Transport (Permits) (Amendment) Regulations, 1984. Citation

2. The Road Transport (Permits) Regulations are hereby amended by inserting immediately after regulation 18A thereof, the following new regulation — Insertion

“Penalty
for failure
to observe

18B. (1) Any driver of an authorized vehicle who, without reasonable cause the proof of which shall lie on him, fails to observe the departure and arrival times in accordance with the provisions of regulation 18A shall be guilty of an offence.

(2) Any person guilty of an offence under this regulation shall be liable on conviction —

- (a) in the case of a first offence to a fine not exceeding P50; and
- (b) in the case of second or subsequent offence to a fine not exceeding P100.

(3) The Secretary may, where a person has been convicted more than two times of an offence under this regulation, revoke the permit issued in respect of such vehicle.

(4) It is a defence to a charge under this regulation if the accused person proves that he was prevented from complying with the provisions of subregulation (1) by stress of weather or other reasonable cause.”
