IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Works and Communications by section 30 of the Botswana Telecommunications Corporation Act, and after consultation with the Board, the following Regulations are hereby made —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Telecommunications (Amendment) (No. 2) Regulations, 1984, and shall be deemed to have come into force on 1st July, 1984.

2. Paragraph 1 of the Schedule to the Telecommunications Regulations, 1981 (in these Regulations referred to as the "principal Regulations") is hereby amended —

(a) in subparagraph 1.1 (p) thereof by substituting for the provisions which appear therein the following new provisions —

"(p) Extension Bell internal Rental P20,00 P19,25
Extension Bell external Rental P28,60 P28,87";

(b) in subparagraph 1.2 (j) thereof by substituting for the provisions which appear therein the following new provisions —

"(j) Deposit for telephone service Note 7";

(c) in subparagraph 1.6 thereof by substituting for —

(i) the words "S/A (Station to Station)", which appear in subparagraph 1.6 I.C the following new words, "S/S (Station to Station)";

(ii) the amount of "P13,50" which appears in column s/s in relation to Luxemburg and Portugal under the heading of "INTERNATIONAL OPERATOR CONNECTED CALLS STANDARD CHARTS", the amount of "P13,80", and

(iii) the amount of "P 3,50" which appears in the unclassified column under the heading of "INTERNATIONAL OPERATOR CONNECTED CALLS STANDARD CHARTS", the amount of "P 3,30".

3. Paragraph 2 of the Schedule to the principal Regulations is hereby amended —

(a) in subparagraph 2.1 (a) thereof by substituting for the amount of "P935,00" which appears under the column of "Connexion Charge", the amount of "P395,00";

- (b) in subparagraph 2.3 thereof by substituting for the amount of "10t" which appears under the heading of "Group 4" in relation to "calls between numbers in different groups per minute," the amount of "30t"; and
- (c) in subparagraph 2.4 thereof by substituting for the existing charges for international calls connected automatically for the countries specified in the first column hereto, the new charges specified in the second column in relation to each country —

4. Paragraph 3 of the Schedule to the principal Regulations is hereby amended in subparagraph 3.2 thereof by substituting for the amounts "0,85t" and "0,45t" for Telegraph International Transmission charges in relation to China Peoples Republic and the Republic of Maldives respectively the new amount of "80t" for each country.

5. Paragraph 5 of the Schedule to the principal Regulations is hereby amended in subparagraph 5.3 thereof by substituting for the amount of radio licence fees of "P125,00", "P 93,75", "P62,50" and "P 31,25" in relation to fees for annual station fee, April to June, July to September and October to December respectively in respect of fixed station within 10 km of Gaborone, the following amounts of "P75,00", "P56,25", "P37,50" and "P18,75" respectively.
