ARRANGEMENT OF PARAGRAPHS

PARAGRAPH

1. Citation
2. Amendment of regulation 2 of Cap. 32:02 (Sub. Leg.)

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Lands and Housing by section 37 of the Tribal Land Act, the following Regulations are hereby made —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Tribal Land (Amendment) Regulations, 2006. Citation
2. Regulation 2 of the Tribal Land Regulations is amended — Amendment of regulation 2 of Cap. 32:02 (Sub. Leg.)
 - (a) in sub-regulation (2) —
 - (i) by substituting, for the words “21 years” which appear in paragraph (b), the words “26 years”;
 - (ii) by substituting, for paragraph (c), the following new paragraph —
 - (c) “hold a minimum academic qualification of a Secondary School Junior Certificate;”.
 - (b) by substituting, for sub-regulation (3), the following new sub-regulation —
 - (3) “Subject to sub-regulation (3B), the Land Board Selection Committee established in terms of sub-regulation (11) shall interview every person who has, in terms of sub-regulation (1), submitted his or her application to the secretary of the land board”.
 - (c) by inserting, immediately after sub-regulation (3), the following new sub-regulations —

“(3A) The Land Board Selection Committee shall, from among the persons interviewed in terms of sub-regulation (3), shortlist 15 candidates and refer them to the *Kgotla* for election.

(3B) The Land Board Selection Committee shall only interview an applicant who qualifies as a candidate in terms of sub-regulation (2) of this regulation and is not disqualified from being appointed in terms of section 3(3) of the Act.”; and
 - (d) by substituting, for sub-regulation (4), the following new sub-regulation —
 - (4) “Voting at a *kgotla* shall be by simplified secret ballot box, and every person who has cast a vote shall have the tip of his or her thumb dipped into indelible ink to indicate that he or she has voted.”.
