ARRANGEMENT OF REGULATIONS

REGULATION

1. Citation
2. Amendment of regulation 17 of Cap. 71:01 (Sub. Leg.)
3. Amendment of regulation 41 of the Regulations

IN EXERCISE of the powers conferred on the Minister of Transport and Public Works by section 89 of the Civil Aviation Act and on the recommendation of the Civil Aviation Authority, the following Regulations are hereby made —

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Civil Aviation (Aerial Work) (Amendment) Regulations, 2022. Citation
2. Regulation 17 of the Civil Aviation (Aerial Work) Regulations (hereinafter referred to as “the Regulations”) is amended by — Amendment of regulation 17 of Cap. 71:01 (Sub. Leg.)
 - (a) substituting for subregulation (9), the following new subregulation —
“**(9) A person shall not act as a pilot in command for agricultural operations unless the person has at least —**
 - (a) 25 hours of pilot in command flight time in the make and basic model of the aircraft to be used during agricultural air operations including at least 10 hours within the preceding 12 months; and
 - (b) 100 hours of flight experience as pilot in command in dispensing agricultural agrochemicals; and
 - (b) inserting a new subregulation immediately after subregulation (9) —
“**(10) Except for a helicopter, an aircraft used in agricultural operations shall be capable of jettisoning at least one half of the aircraft’s maximum authorised load of agricultural material within 45 minutes and where the aircraft is equipped to release the tank or hopper as a unit, there shall be a means to prevent inadvertent release by the pilot or crew.**”.
3. The Regulations are amended by substituting for regulation 41, the following new regulation — Amendment of regulation 41 of the Regulations

“**Safety management system** 41. A holder of a certificate issued under these Regulations shall establish and maintain a safety management system in accordance with the Civil Aviation (Safety Management) Regulations.”.
